A 40 minute program begins with Richard bringing his hands to life. His left hand "Lefty" things that the right hand, "Righty" (shorter arm with two fingers) can't do things he can do. "Righty" quickly explains that just because someone looks different doesn't mean that they can't do things as long as they try!

Next Richard demonstrates to the children how important **diversity** is to our world. Pictures of famous historical figures come to life to light-heartedly share some facts and information.
